This course will consist in a close reading of three recent books in ethical theory that span issues in normative ethics and metaethics:

Julia Markovits, *Moral Reason* (MR), Oxford University Press, 2014

T. M. Scanlon, *Being Realistic About Reasons* (BRR), Oxford University Press, 2014

R. Jay Wallace, *The View From Here: On Attachment, Affirmation, and the Limits of Regret* (VFH), Oxford University Press, 2013

These will be accompanied by relevant associated readings.

The first two books focus on fundamental metaethical (metaphysical and epistemological) issues about the nature of reasons and moral reasons. And the last focuses more on normative issues about the relation of central ethical ideas to the perspectival character of ethical experience. All three are available through the Yale Bookstore.

Students will write 3 (2-3 page) response papers, sent by email to me by 5 pm on Monday preceding the seminar—so  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the class will have response papers due in any given week. These should take up and critically engage some point or points from the reading for that week. The idea is not to summarize the reading, but to dig deeply into some aspect of it, trying to understand it better, raise criticisms, consider how the author might respond to the criticisms, and so on.

Students will also write a 15-20-page essay on a topic of their choosing relevant to the class.
